

If your child is eligible for FSM they may also be eligible for an exclusive place on the Club4 programme. For the main school holidays, all eligible children at school in Surrey have the chance to secure a free place at one of over 100 day camps running across the County. 
Welcome Back Party raises over £3,600!

We all take **what we can, when we can**, with **no deadline to return**.


Everyone is busy (with their own washing piles!) so it **does not need to be a huge commitment**; even just once a term would be a huge help.
