- Proof-read for spelling errors linked to spelling statements for Year 6
- Evaluate and edit making changes to vocabulary, grammar and punctuation to enhance effects
- Plan narratives through reasoned consideration of how authors have developed characters and settings
- Maintain positive attitudes to reading and understanding of what he/she reads by identifying and discussing themes and conventions.

MATHS

Multiplication, Division and Fractions

- Compare and order fractions, including fractions that are larger than 1 and mixed and improper fractions
- Multiply simple pairs of proper fractions, writing the answer in its simplest form e.g. $1/4 \times 1/2 = 1/8$
- Add and subtract fractions with different denominators and mixed numbers, using the concept of equivalent fractions
- Multiply simple pairs of proper fractions, writing the answer in its simplest form.

SCIENCE

Evolution and Inheritance

- Recognise that living things have changed over time and that fossils provide information about living things that inhabited the Earth millions of years ago
- Recognise that living things produce offspring of the same kind, but normally offspring vary and are not identical to their parents
- Identify how animals and plants are adapted to suit their environment
- Investigate evolution theories.

- Compare, contrast and evaluate primary and secondary sources from WWII
- Justify opinions with reasons and facts
- Develop chronological understanding of events preceding and during WWII
- Evaluate the impact WWII had on the world.
