Dinner Payment

Year 3 – 6

If your child is in Year 3 - 6 and pays for school dinners, the cost for the Spring term is as follows:
£13.75 per week or £74.25 until February half term.

Payments can be made via your child's Scopay account. Dinners need to be paid for in advance. This does not apply to those children that receive benefit related Free School Meals. Thank you for your co-operation with this.

Deadline to apply for your child's Reception place

Nursery

We wanted to remind parents again that the deadline for applying for your child's Reception place is Monday 15th January. Even though you attend the Riverbridge nursery you will still need to apply for a school place as attendance in the nursery does not guarantee you a place in Reception.

If you have already applied you will have received a confirmation email with a reference number. If you haven't received this email we suggest you log into your e-admission account to check that your application has been submitted.

If you have not yet applied we recommend you apply soon, rather than leaving it to the deadline date in case of any technical difficulties via <https://www.eadmissions.org.uk/eAdmissions/app>. Please note that you do not need to complete a supplementary form if applying for Riverbridge. If you have any questions, please email the office.

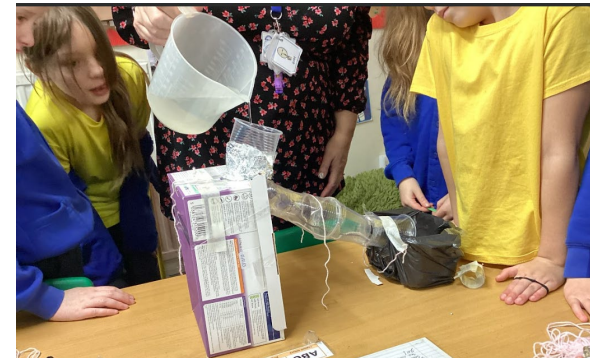
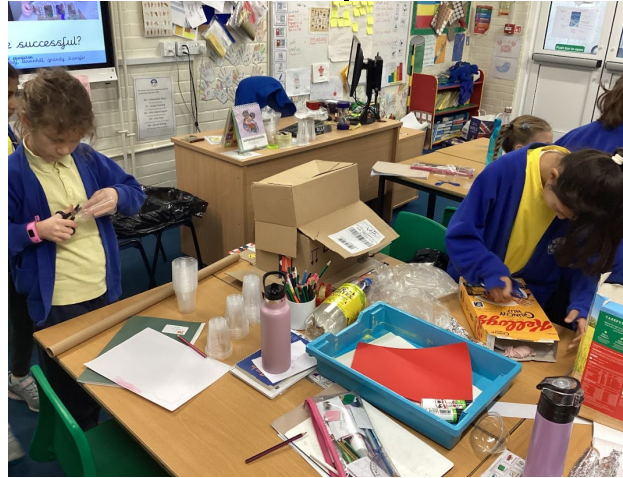
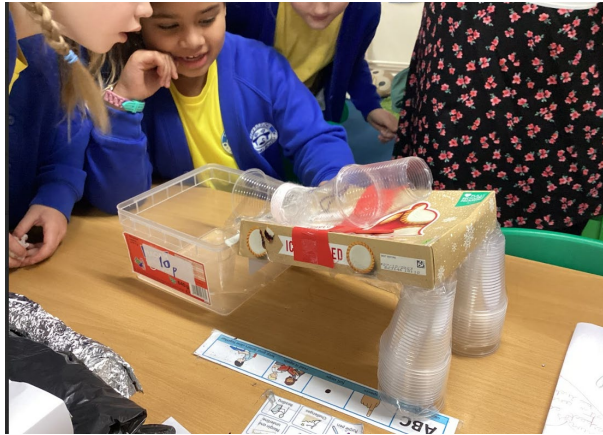
