As I mentioned in last week's Review, this has been a busy five days!

On Wednesday we were visited by not one, but two of our school Governors. They joined members of the schools Senior Leadership Team to tour both bases and look at the way the children were learning and their behaviour in classroom. These were positive visits and I was struck by the level of engagement in the learning I saw.

As part of the above, I visited 1C and they were particularly keen to talk to me about the things they have learned during Space Week 2024. There were many children able to talk about the Solar System, planets, stars and travelling into space. I have also heard that this enthusiasm was repeated throughout the school which is great to hear.

This week has given us an opportunity to 'Feel Good'; reflecting on what helps us to feel positive about ourselves and what we can do to help us manage our emotions well. We continue to use 'Zones of Regulation' in all the classrooms from Reception to Year 6 and this helps the children to 'sense check' how they are feeling and how this might impact on their ability to learn. There are resources in all classrooms that are used by the children to help them when they are 'not in the green zone'.
