

ENGLISH

When The Sky Falls by Phil Earle

- Proof-read for spelling errors linked to spelling statements for Year 6.
- Evaluate and edit making changes to vocabulary, grammar and punctuation to enhance effects.
- Plan narratives through reasoned consideration of how authors have developed characters and settings.
- Maintain positive attitudes to reading and understanding of what he/she reads by identifying and discussing themes and conventions.

MATHS

Multiplication, Division and Fractions

- Compare and order fractions, including fractions that are larger than 1 and mixed and improper fractions.
- Multiply simple pairs of proper fractions, writing the answer in its simplest form e.g. $1/4 \times 1/2 = 1/8$.
- Add and subtract fractions with different denominators and mixed numbers, using the concept of equivalent fractions.
- Multiply simple pairs of proper fractions, writing the answer in its simplest form.

SCIENCE

Evolution and Inheritance

- Recognise that living things have changed over time and that fossils provide information about living things that inhabited the Earth millions of years ago.
- Recognise that living things produce offspring of the same kind, but normally offspring vary and are not identical to their parents.
- Identify how animals and plants are adapted to suit their environment.
- Investigate evolution theories.

HISTORY

The Great Wars – WW1 and WW2

- Use sources to inform us about World War I and II and evaluate their effectiveness.
- Devise historically valid questions about change, cause, similarity, difference and significance.
- Developing an understanding of chronology.
- Identify historically significant people and events.

MUSIC

Songs of World War Two

- Discussing musical eras in context, identifying how they have influenced each other.
- Use musical and comparative language in discussion.
- Follow the melody line.
- Follow the scores with a good sense of timing, showing that they understand which section of pitch they are singing.

Coding

- Highlight the importance of positive online relationships.
- Writing algorithms to create animations and basic games.
- Look for errors in code and debug where necessary.

FRENCH

Le Week-end

- Write simple and some complex familiar sentences from memory with understandable accuracy.
- Understand and use the 'faire' and 'jouer' conjugations both orally and in writing.
- Express likes, dislikes and opinions.
- To use the negative form 'ne'.

DT

Gingerbread Houses

- Generate and communicate their ideas through discussion, annotated sketches, prototypes and computer-aided design.
- Make detailed evaluations against their original criteria and suggest ways that their product could be improved.

PE

Basketball, Gymnastics and Games (Tuesday afternoons)

- Play competitive games.
- Apply basic principles for attacking and defending.
- Demonstrate good sportsmanship.

PSHE

Celebrating difference

- Empathise with people who are living with disabilities and celebrate people's differences.

- Identify strategies in managing feelings in bullying situations.
