School Dates – 2026-2027

As you will be aware, Surrey County Council has determined that their local authority maintained schools should move to a two-week half term in October 2026. As an academy, Riverbridge is not required to follow the local authority's decision about term dates, however we have chosen to do so, because we feel to do otherwise may negatively impact our families with children in our feeder secondary schools. Therefore, the half term in Autumn 2026 will be a two-week half term (Oct 19th to 30th 2026). Our end of academic year will remain the same (roughly 3rd week in July), as we will be exercising our academy freedom by making up additional weeks within the timings of the school day across the rest of the year.

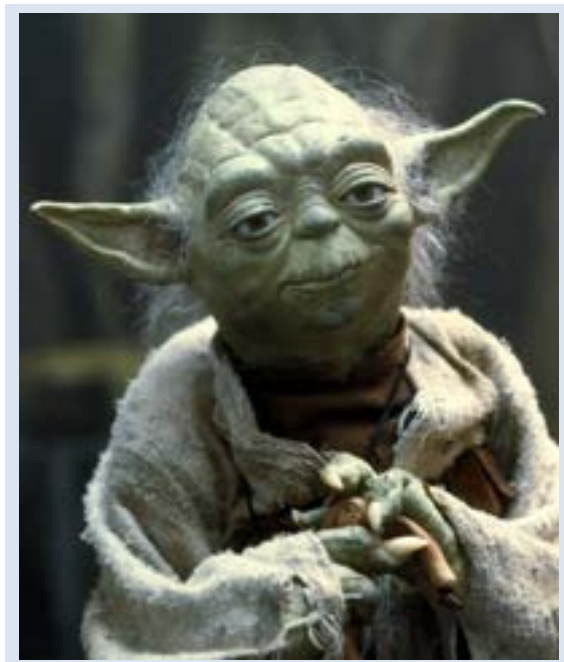

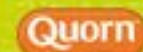

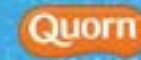
