We have had a number of new children joining us in the nursery. It has been great to see how well the other children have welcomed them and how quickly they have settled. Well done everyone!

As part of the safeguarding practices, we have at Riverbridge, each week we monitor the use of the internet at school. The school system flags any searches made or words typed that might be problematic and Mrs Price and I look through each of these. The majority are not concerning but there are occasions when children have typed or searched something without realising that this search will be registered and challenged. When necessary - parents are informed so that they can also reiterate the message of how to be safe online.

How to help children to be digitally safe is a concern that many parents and carers return to. There are lots of resources and websites that are useful here and I am flagging the following:

to Being Our Best.

We will find out about their life, how they overcame obstacles and how they demonstrated determination to succeed.

**Desmond Doss  
Soldier**

**Active    Compassionate    Thinker**



In Monday's assembly we found out about an American soldier who became an unlikely hero of World War II: Desmond Doss.

Desmond Doss is a powerful example of standing by your values—even when it's hard. During World War II, Doss served as a U.S. Army medic and became the first conscientious objector to receive the Medal of Honour. Because of his deep religious beliefs, he refused to carry a weapon, choosing instead to save lives.

At first, Doss was mocked and doubted by fellow soldiers. But on the battlefield, his courage spoke louder than words. During the brutal Battle of Okinawa, he repeatedly risked his life to rescue wounded soldiers—lowering them to safety one by one, all while under enemy fire. It's estimated he saved at least 75 men that day.

Desmond Doss's story reminds us—and our children—that bravery doesn't always look the same. Sometimes it means helping instead of fighting, holding firm to your beliefs, and doing what's right even when you stand alone. His life is a meaningful starting point for family conversations about courage, integrity, and compassion.

*'I don't know how I am going to live with myself if I don't stay true to what I believe.'*

# The Principles of Nurture

## The Importance of Nurture for the Development of Wellbeing

### What it means?

Nurture refers to the care, relationships, and experiences that shape a child's emotional, social, and physical development. While children are born with certain traits, it is nurturing relationships and environments that help them feel safe, valued, and able to thrive.

### Why it matters...

Children's wellbeing develops through consistent, positive interactions with caring adults. Nurture helps children to:

- Feel safe and secure
- Develop confidence and self-esteem
- Learn how to manage emotions
- Build healthy relationships
- Cope with stress and challenges



Research shows that warm, responsive caregiving supports healthy brain development and lays the foundation for lifelong mental and emotional health.

### How parents can help...

You don't need to be perfect—small, consistent actions matter most:

- Spend quality time together, even for short moments
- Listen and acknowledge your child's feelings
- Offer praise and encouragement
- Provide comfort during difficult moments
- Set clear, calm boundaries with warmth and understanding

### Remember

**“Nurture, loving relationships and positive experiences help children grow into healthy, capable adults.”**

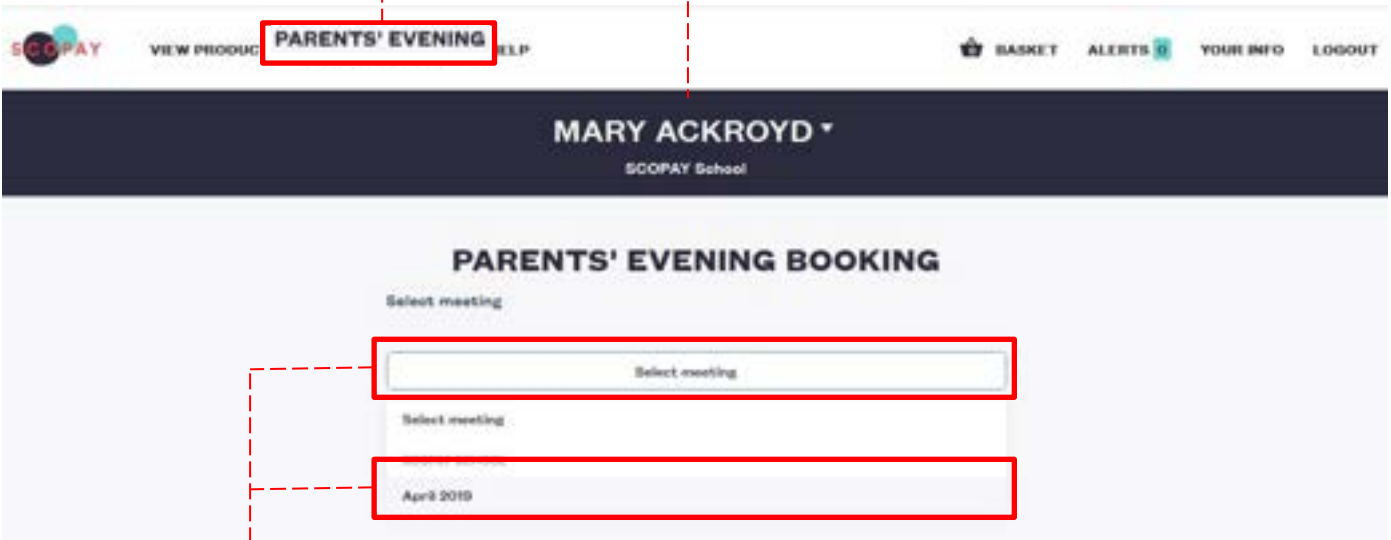
