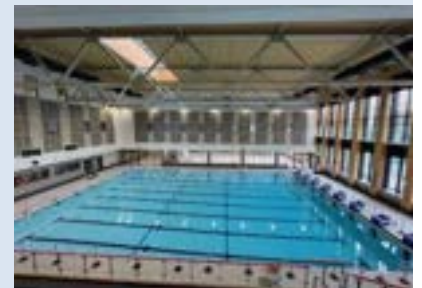

### Whole School

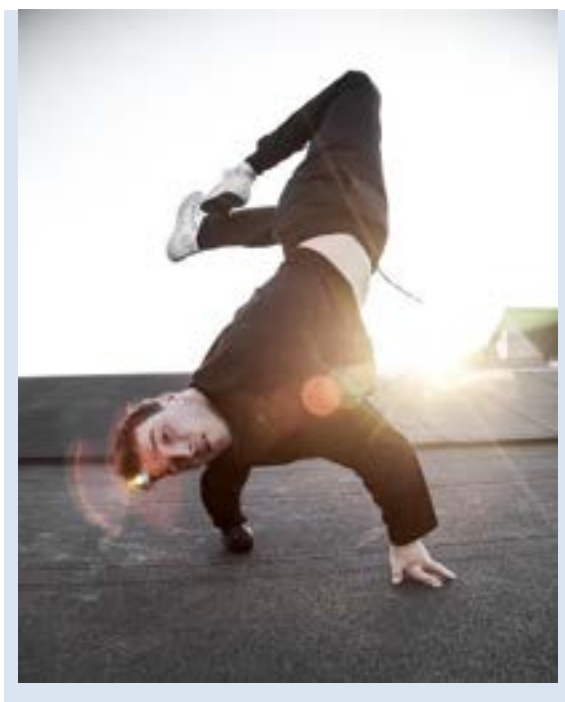
This year's assemblies have focused on people who have demonstrated any of the school's 8 Great Ways to Being Our Best.

#### 'Redo' Break-dancer

#### Active Ambitious Independent

On Monday, we found out about a Dutch break-dancer, Redouan A Chitt who showed us that, with determination and confidence, we can achieve amazing things.



Redouan also known as 'Redo' was born with several physical disabilities. He was missing part of his right arm and had problems with his hips and legs. Doctors even said he might never walk properly. But Redouan did not let these challenges stop him from following his dreams.

As a child, he discovered breakdancing and loved the music, movement, and creativity. At first, dancing was very difficult for him, and people doubted he could do it. However, Redouan practised again and again. Through hard work and courage, he became an internationally famous break-dancer, performing in competitions and inspiring audiences around the world.

What makes Redouan special is not just his incredible dance moves, but also his positive attitude. He believes that everyone has unique talents and that our differences can make us stronger. He often speaks to young people about believing in themselves, working hard, and never giving up.

Redouan A Chitt reminds us that success is not about being perfect — it is about having courage, determination, and a positive mindset. He is a wonderful example of resilience and inspiration for children and adults everywhere.
