On Monday, we learned about a software engineer, entrepreneur and author from Ghana: Farida Bedwei.

She was born with cerebral palsy, a condition that affects movement and coordination. Despite facing many challenges as a child, Farida worked hard at school and followed her passion for technology and problem-solving.

She became a successful software engineer and helped create banking software used by financial institutions in Ghana. Farida is also a strong advocate for disability awareness and inclusion. She encourages young people to believe in themselves and reminds us that everyone has unique talents and abilities.

Our children have enjoyed discussing Farida's story and thinking about the important values she demonstrates: such as perseverance, confidence, kindness and inclusion.

We have learned that challenges do not have to stop us from achieving our dreams.

Parent Governor Election

On behalf of the Riverbridge Governors I am writing to inform you that there is 1 vacancy for a Parent Governor to serve on our Local Governing Body. I would like to invite you to consider standing for election as a Parent Governor or, if you wish, to nominate another parent.

A Local Governing Body is a vital part of our school, assisting the Board of Directors decision making by enabling more detailed consideration to ensure the school is meeting the pupils' needs effectively.

The Local Governing Body meets once each term in person and governors will also be expected to carry out a termly visit to the school as well as complete tailored governor training to increase their knowledge. No qualifications are required to be a governor, other than a keen interest in school life, commitment and a willingness to learn.

If you wish to stand for election, please complete the enclosed nomination form and return it to the School Office **by noon on Friday 19th June 2026**. You will see that each person nominated has to be a legally recognised parent/guardian of a child at this school and has to be proposed and seconded by parents who also have a child at the school.

Anyone wishing to stand for election should supply, with their nomination, a short personal statement for circulation to parents, if a ballot is required. The purpose of the statement is to provide a biographical background, reasons for wishing to stand and an indication of the proposed contribution the candidate could make to the Local Governing Body. The statements should be brief, up to 200 words should be seen as a maximum and ideally sent electronically.

A ballot will be held if there are more nominees than vacancies available, and if this is the case, arrangements will be confirmed to you.

In advance of any ballot or appointment it is an expectation that prospective candidates meet with Lumen Learning Trust and governance leaders so they can learn more about the role of a parent governor, what it entails and the skillset a candidate should have to be successful in the role of supporting Riverbridge Primary. The session will take place on Monday 22nd June at 5.00pm and Thursday 25th June at 4.00pm via Google Meet and all candidates are required to make themselves available for one of the sessions. Please confirm which session you will attend when submitting your nomination form.

I hope you will consider standing as a Governor yourself or nominating someone else you know who would like to help in the governance of your school.

A Parent Governor

We are seeking a person who fits the following description:

- Currently has a child or children in our school;
- Has an open and enquiring mind;
- Shows a willingness to listen and make informed judgements;
- Is able to work well with others;
- Is interested in education generally and our school in particular;
- Has a desire to play a part in supporting and developing our school;
- Is willing to give about 15 hours per term to attend meetings, read papers and attend training.

If you match the above description, you could be the very person to become a parent governor. Everyone has something to offer and we want people from as many backgrounds and interests as possible.

Reward

In return we can offer:

- ▶ An insight into the wider perspective of the school through long-term planning;
- ▶ A chance to develop skills in strategic management;
- ▶ The opportunity to work with our team of Directors, Executive Principal, Governors and Staff in developing our school;
- ▶ Training to develop an understanding of specific school management issues;
- ▶ The support and assistance of the Lumen Learning Trust (LLT) Directors;
- ▶ A sense of achievement in making a difference for the children in our school;
- ▶ The pleasure of seeing children thrive and become successful learners.

The role of the Local Governing Body (LGB) of our school:

- ▶ Is a committee of the Trust Directors and has an advisory role, to support the Directors, in providing support and challenge to the senior leaders;
- ▶ Supports the Executive Principal and Headteacher in their monitoring role within the context of the school's key performance indicators;
- ▶ Supports the Executive Principal in their role regarding duty of care for Headteachers;
- ▶ Supports the Headteachers in their role regarding duty of care for staff;
- ▶ Works collaboratively with the Headteacher on the strategic planning and leadership of the school by adding strength and integrity to evidence cited by the leadership team through questioning, visiting and seeing for yourself what action leaders are taking to achieve the school priorities;
- ▶ Collaborates with governors and school leadership teams from other LLT schools along with Directors & Executive Principal in considering impact of decisions;
- ▶ Keeps abreast with National & local 'landscapes' affecting schools.

Governors link communities and schools

Governors are the link between the school and the community and representatives of all those with an interest in the well-being and reputation of the school are needed.

We are all volunteers, working in our own time, and we are all busy people. However, we feel that we gain much in personal development as well as satisfaction that we have played an important part in improving education in the local community. There are opportunities to work with the Directors on aspects of strategic planning and management, including financial oversight and resources. The Directors Business and Management Committee includes representatives from Local Governing Bodies.

Teamworking

We work together as a team, with a collective responsibility.

Different people

The Local Governing Body seeks individuals from as many different backgrounds as possible, in order to fully reflect the community the school serves. Everyone has something to offer. Specific training (free) is available to develop an understanding of strategic school improvement.

Representing parents

As a parent governor you will be a governor in your own right, with the same responsibilities as everyone else, to work together as part of the Governing Body for the good of the school.

As a parent governor you do not have to vote in a particular way because you have been pressed to do so by parents – you are not the ‘voice’ of the parents; you bring your experience of being a parent in the school to the work of the Local Governing Body. Objectivity, however, is essential. You are not there to promote the interests of your own children, but all children.

Sometimes a parent governor may be approached with a concern. Parent governors are not there to provide an alternative route to addressing individual parental concerns, although if you do become aware of more widespread disquiet about the school’s policy and practice then you should alert the Headteacher and Chair.

Making a difference

Governors can make a real difference to the performance of the school and have a real part to play in making the school successful.

As an effective parent governor you:

- ▶ Help to decide the priorities for supporting and developing the school;
- ▶ Work in partnership with the headteacher, senior leadership team and cooperatively with other governors, to strengthen achievement for all children;
- ▶ Prepare for meetings by reading papers beforehand, as well as keep abreast of developments in education nationally through the press;
- ▶ Take responsibility for your own learning and development, as a governor, including attending training;
- ▶ Prioritise your time to enable you to attend Local Governing Body meetings promptly, regularly, and for the full time;
- ▶ Read briefings and newsletters for governors; present a balanced view of issues representing different sections of the community;
- ▶ Promote the interests of the school in the wider community;
- ▶ Respect the confidentiality of Governing Body affairs. Be loyal to the decisions made by the Governing Body;
- ▶ Never promise anyone to 'solve a problem' on your own;
- ▶ Never press your own child's case at the expense of others;
- ▶ Declare an interest and withdraw from any meeting where you, a partner or close relative or associate stands to gain, or where you are so close to a matter discussed it is difficult to be impartial;
- ▶ Abide by the LGB code of conduct and work within the LGB terms of reference;
- ▶ Use the Nolan Principles of Public Life, as guidance for your governor role.
