We will also be saying goodbye to a number of children across the school today who will be moving to other schools near and far. We thank them for their contribution to Riverbridge over the years.



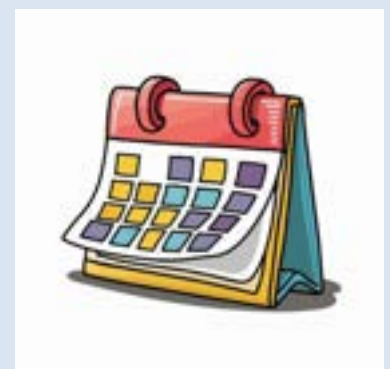

Guidelines for Packed Lunches and Breaktime Snacks

Whole School

We are a No Nut School

We would like to remind you that Riverbridge is a no nut school therefore we do not allow any food containing nuts to be consumed anywhere on the school grounds.

Please do not give your child any food that contains nuts.

This includes:

- Nutella and hazelnut based products,

- sesame and sesame seed based products including hummus,
- pesto
- cereal bars,
- peanut butter,
- chicken satay etc

If you are unsure, we would be grateful if you could check the ingredients before you pack their lunches, this will be hi-lighted in bold on the ingredient list.

This is very important as there are children that have a severe allergies and we all need to adhere to this rule to keep everyone safe.

Healthy Snack for Break Time

All children are welcome to bring a healthy snack to school to eat during their break time. These should be in as little packaging as possible because we're also keen to reduce our use of plastics (e.g. no bear yoyo's or fruit winders).

These snacks are limited to:

- Fresh fruit
- Fresh vegetables
- Dried fruit
- Plain rice cakes
- Bread sticks
- Yoghurt tube
- Plain crackers
- Pitta bread or wraps (with no filling)

If children come into school with something that is not on the list it will be sent back home. No cutlery should be brought in. A reminder that only Reception and Key Stage 1 children are provided daily fruit or vegetables as part of the Government scheme.

We paid for new playground equipment in PAB, plants for the Grove, and a host of different events for year groups right across the school (see our poster at the end of this newsletter). We were also able to give £150 to every class for teachers to spend on extra resources and equipment.

Thank you to everyone who has supported us this year by attending our fundraising events, donating or raising money (especially our Staines 10K runners!) and volunteering time to ensure our events are a success. We couldn't do any of it without you!

Graphic Designer: Designs posters and flyers for our events. We have templates for most of our events but it would be great to get someone involved who has a flair for design and can make our posters more appealing!

John Nash Mathematician

In the last assembly on Monday, we found out about John Nash, a brilliant mathematician whose ideas continue to influence the modern world.

John Nash was an American mathematician who loved solving problems and thinking in creative ways. From a young age, he showed a great interest in numbers and patterns. As he grew older, he developed important mathematical ideas that helped people better understand decision-making, teamwork, and problem-solving.

Although some of his work was very complex, the children learned that mathematics is not just about numbers — it is also about thinking carefully, spotting patterns, and finding solutions to challenges.

Learning about John Nash has helped pupils understand that curiosity, determination, and creative thinking can lead to exciting discoveries and achievements.
