<u>When/How will they be taught?</u>	In Autumn 1 Science , we will be covering 'living things and their habitats' and will cover the Year 3 aims within this. In Spring 1 DT , we will be looking at nutrient and varied diets as part of our 'why can't we live without chocolate' topic?	In Autumn 1 Computing , we will look at e-safety including using search engines responsibly. In Autumn 2 Computing , we will be covering coding algorithms and will learn to use coding software including beebots.	Ancient Egyptians were covered in-depth through the home learning offer during the Summer terms. We also aim to cover some aspects during our Geography topic in Autumn 1 when looking at desert biomes.	Russia was covered in-depth through the home learning offer during the Summer terms. We will continue to develop our understanding and ability to compare foreign countries during our Spring 2 Geography topic.	In Autumn 1 RE , we are looking at 'how can we live together in one world?' and will include a study of Sikhism.

<u>When/How will they be taught?</u>	<p>Circle Times: Additional circle times to reflect on shared experiences, exploring children's personal responses to the changes they have experienced.</p> <p>JIGSAW Summer 1 and 2 Themes: 'spiral' curriculum – exploring these themes during the Summer curriculum in Year 4.</p>	<p>Mindful Movement: Additional movement breaks to support return to school.</p> <p>Team Games: Team games to be played throughout the PE topics of the Year.</p> <p>Athletics: Covered during Year 4 Summer terms.</p>	<p>In Autumn 1 Art, we will look at how to change the tone of colours to suit the mood of the piece.</p> <p>In Spring 2 Art, we will look at how colours can be used to convey themes.</p>	<p>In Summer 1 DT, we will look at textures and textiles to design and produce a final piece which includes use the skills of sewing.</p> <p>In Autumn 2 DT, we will look at different materials and how they can be used for different purposes.</p>	<p>Instead, in Autumn 1 Music, we will study composers and how they use different instruments to play a part in a story.</p>
