It is unusual for the school to be sharing a newsletter before the start of term but I am sure you would appreciate these are very unusual times. This Review is intended to share all the necessary information for parents and carers to make the return to school as smooth as possible.

First – some reminders:

The expectation is that all children will return to school next week. Regular **attendance** at school will be a positive way to ensure children settle back into routines quickly.



When we return to school, we will have a **rolling start** and a **rolling finish**. This should help us manage the number of adults that will be on the school site at the beginning and the end of the day. These timings were shared with parents in July and this is re-shared today – see below.

With the aim to ensure things are as normal as possible for the children, we ask that children attend school in normal school **uniform**. On PE days, children should come into school in their kits to avoid changing.

The plans in place for September are thorough but not set in stone. We understand that there will be a degree of flexibility required to ensure that all runs smoothly. We will rely, as ever, on working closely with you as parents. If you see or spot something that could be done differently or better, please do share these thoughts with the school office. This will help us all keep safe!

Finally, I hope that you have all had a positive summer holiday and enjoyed time with your families. We look forward to seeing the majority of you next week and for things to be running smoothly for everyone in the weeks to come.

Rolling Start and Rolling Finish

Whole School

A reminder of these timings are included below.

Please remember that we are asking that parents do not enter the school site at the beginning of the day. Please aim to plan your journey carefully. Please park sensibly and walk towards school avoiding too many crowds.

Being Our Best

Should you need to pass a message to your child's class teachers, please do so via the school office – ideally via email to maximise social distancing in the office areas.

Collection times are also included below. Parents and carers are able to access the school site if needed. Please can I ask that everyone who comes onto the school site is respectful of social distancing.

Whilst it is not current public health advice for children under 11 to wear masks, parents and carers may wish to wear these when travelling to school, queueing outside the school and waiting to collect your children at the end of the day.

Some guidance around the wearing of masks is included at the end of this week's Review. The PTA are also sourcing Riverbridge Primary School Masks which may be of interest (and will raise funds for the school at the same time!) Further details will follow next week.

Drop off and collection arrangements

Whole School

These are understandably detailed and the links to these are attached to the Review and available on the school's website.

Whilst much planning has gone into the creation of these plans, we will only really understand how well they are working when the term starts. Please can I ask for all parents to be patient and flexible. Everything we are doing in preparation for the children's full return to school is about keeping them and the whole community safe. If plans do change – we will share this with you in a timely way.

Practical Arrangements

Whole School

Each class and year group will be considered a constant group that does not mix with other groups within the school. This will help reduce any risk of transmission. In classrooms, children will not be able to socially distance from each other but the enhanced hygiene routines will continue to be in place. This will include regular handwashing, reminders about good respiratory hygiene ('catch it, bin it, kill it'), ventilation across the school and access to outdoor learning when possible.

The school will continue to have additional cleaning in place to ensure touch points are cleaned and disinfected.

Child Illness

Whole School

We are mindful that the Autumn Term is often when children (and adults) will come down with colds. We will continue to deal with this following our normal procedures. Parents are encouraged to continue to send children into school so as to maximize their attendance.

Should a child be displaying COVID-19 symptoms, however please follow the NHS guidance on staying at home and self-isolating and ensure that your child gets tested as quickly as possible. As per our protocols, can parents please let the school know if symptoms develop at home and the outcome of the test when received.

If a child displays symptoms whilst in school, they will be 'isolated' in a separate room. A member of staff will remain with them until their parents can come into school to collect them. Staff will wear appropriate PPE in these cases.

As a community, we want to ensure the safety of everyone at Riverbridge and we will manage any potential

illness or testing sensitively. If a child or staff member in a group tests positive for Covid-19, we will follow guidance from Public Health England which will involve informing the parents and staff of that group. We would ask parents to avoid sharing information about this on social media so as to avoid any unnecessary confusion or panic. Thank you in advance.

Specific Medical or Emotional Needs

Whole School

Our aim is to ensure that all children return to school and that this will feel as normal as possible. We are mindful that some parents may have concerns about their child returning to school. We are here to support so please do make contact with the school office and we will get in contact next week.

Offices

Whole School

Both school offices will of course be manned as usual from Tuesday and we are keen to maintain our 'open door' policy and are always happy to help. However please can we ask that you email your question or comments to office.riverbridge@lumenlearningtrust.co.uk if it is at all possible? This will hopefully help to alleviate the congestion at offices: as you are aware the entrances are small spaces so we will need to limit the number of parents entering. Once again please be considerate of other people and maintain distancing.

Sharing Data and Information to support children to access local health and wellbeing services

Whole School

Surrey Children's Community Health Provider, Children and Family Health Surrey request regular information from us about our children to support planning and delivery of school based health screening at different points of a child's life. Information provided to them by the school is Name, Gender, Address and DOB. Assurances have been received from the Service that this request is in accordance with Government guidelines and adheres to the required Data Protection standards. Swimming

Year 4

In previous years swimming lessons have been part of the curriculum in Year 4. We have been in contact with the Leisure Centre and at the present time they are unable to offer this. We will, of course, keep in contact with them throughout the weeks ahead and will let parents know as and when the situation improves.

Year 5 and 6 Walk Home Permission

Whole School

Children in Years 5 and 6 will continue to be allowed to walk home on their own-providing of course they act responsibly around social distancing etc. With this in mind we have attached the letter for you to sign if you would like your child to be released from class on their own. The form can be printed and returned or emailed back to office.riverbridge@lumenlearningtrust.co.uk. For children in Year 6 if you signed this form last year then there is no need for parents to sign again.

Mobile Phones

Whole School

From September onwards, we are asking that only those children that are walking to and from school by themselves should bring a mobile phone into school. These phones will be individually stored in each classroom so as to avoid any potential contamination. As was the case previously, any mobile phone brought into school by a child will be at their own risk.

Reception Start Dates

We are very much looking forward to welcoming the 'new additions' to our Riverbridge Community in Reception and Nursery. Start dates have all been advised separately as we stagger the children's entry into school. They are also on the diary dates below.

Reception

Summer born children - Wednesday 9th September

Spring born children - **Thursday 10th September**

Autumn born children - **Friday 11th September**

The children will attend **8.45 to 1pm** for these days and then **all children** join **full time** from **Monday 14th September**.

Nursery

Parents have all received a letter advising times and start dates, commencing Monday 14th September

School Dinners

At the start of the new term school dinners will look a little different. Children in Nursery will have their lunch in their Nursery setting as usual. Children in Reception through to Year 4 will have their lunch in their respective Halls. So too will children in years 5 and 6 who have school dinners.

Years 5 and 6 children with packed lunches will eat in their classrooms. The lunch times will also be staggered from 11.45-1.15pm with each year group having an hour's lunch break within these times. The seating in the hall has been arranged to allow an extended space between children while they eat their lunch. This plan has been devised to ensure that the number of children in the hall at any one time is restricted and to manage space outside more effectively. Each year group has been allocated a play space outside and a range of play equipment that only their year group can share. Adults in each year group will ensure the equipment is regularly cleaned. Children will be allowed to play with children in their year group when outside, however they will not be able to mix with children from other year groups at the moment. Children will wash and sanitise their hands before and after lunch.

To support these arrangements, abm our caterers have produced a menu that will work under the current restrictions. We have attached this menu to the Review and it will also be uploaded to the website, further details regarding payments and cost will be included in next week's Review

Looking forward to seeing you when school returns for most children on Wednesday 2nd September.

We are confident with the current protective measures we have had in place for the second half of the Summer Term and will be able to scale this up when all children are attending.

Attendance	From Wednesday 2nd September , all children are expected to be in school and any absence that is not deemed exceptional will be unauthorised. The teachers will take the register each morning as usual. If your child is not in school on their expected days, a member of the office staff will contact you to find out why they are not in school. This is in line with our standard safeguarding measures regarding attendance. Therefore, if your child is not attending for any reason please inform the office via email or phone call before 9:15am.				
Breakfast Club	The Breakfast Club will relocate to Park Avenue The first day the club will run is Monday 7th September				
Enrichment Clubs	These will not run in the first half of the Autumn Term. We will aim to re-introduce these when it is deemed safe to do so. We will keep all parents fully informed.				
Equipment Required	Children will have access to appropriate resources and will not need to bring anything into school other than a water bottle, a packed lunch (if your child is having one) and a suitable snack (as necessary). No children on either base will need to bring a bag or a book bag from September until instructed otherwise.				
Hygiene	Children will be directed to wash their hands for at least 20 seconds with soap and water on arrival; before and after playing outside; before eating and going home; and at various times throughout the school day. We will also be promoting good respiratory hygiene: the 'catch it, bin it, kill it' approach. Boxes of tissues will be available in every room. There will be enhanced cleaning routines in place which will include additional cleaning at lunchtimes. There will also be additional cleaning of toilets throughout the day to maximise the children's safety in these spaces.				
Practical Issues	Each class will be considered a consistent group that will only have contact with children in their year group. This will help to reduce the risk of transmission by limiting the number of pupils and staff that come in contact with each other. Staff who will be working across groups of children will socially distance from the children. Staff who are based with the same group of children will reduce "close contact" with children but maintaining this will not always be possible due to the nature of how primary school children interact. To avoid contact and mixing between groups, the timetable will be adjusted to create staggered break time and lunches. Windows will be kept open throughout the day to ventilate the school. Face coverings will be optional for children and staff. Children will be shown how to remove their face coverings safely.

Back to school safely in Surrey



Welcoming children and young people back to school

It is vital that Surrey children and young people return to school for their education progress, their well-being and wider development. In support of the Government's plan, we expect that all Surrey children and young people in all year groups return to school from the start of term in September 2020.

Staying safe **INSIDE** school

We now better understand how to create a safer environment in schools and education settings. We are supporting all schools and education settings to follow the latest guidance and put in place protection and infection control such as 'bubbles', one-way systems, hand washing and sanitising facilities, and staggered starts.

Stay safe **OUTSIDE** school as well

Parents and pupils will see each other again outside of school. With Coronavirus (COVID-19) still being transmitted in our local areas and the colder weather coming, it's important to remember to socially distance outside of the school gate. Keep two metres where possible from other parents, pupils and teachers beyond your own household group and wider support bubble.

Stay at home if you have symptoms

A small number of children and young people will be unable to attend school because they are self-isolating, have symptoms or have a positive test result or are in close contact with someone with coronavirus. In these circumstances talk to your school to find out about how learning can be continued at home. Shielding advice was ended by the Government on 1st August. If your child or a member of the household was shielding previously, you can now send your child back to school. Please contact your health professional for further advice and guidance if required. If you are advised by a health professional not to send your child back to school their non-attendance will not be penalised.

School attendance is mandatory from the start of the new academic year and parents and carers have a lawful duty to send their child to school. Should you have any concerns about your child returning to school you should discuss this with your school in the first instance.
